FROM THE PASTOR:

Since most of us have never lived in a kingdom and have no experience of relating to a king, our notion of kings and kingdoms tends to be along the lines of Camelot; filled with handsome men, fair damsels, great wealth, easy comfort, eye-popping love, and pristine peace. It's a grand dream for a kingdom of this world. This festival and the readings, however, hardly take us to this kind of kingdom. The gospel reading is part of a dialogue between Jesus and Pilate at Jesus' trial. On this last Sunday of the liturgical year we clearly see that Jesus' kingdom is not of this world. Christ's kingdom does not belong to this world, but is an interior identity defined by our relationship with Christ the King. Here is where we can have a little bit of Camelot.

Today, we celebrate a King whose presence and power we have already experienced: Christ, whose kingdom is not territory but virtue, not power but service, not wealth but grace. This King has loved us with His very life. He has shown us Camelot.

This Solemnity invites us to renew our commitment to serve Him with all our hearts. It invites us to renew our self-giving stance as disciples who follow the King. Next week, the season of Advent calls us to prepare to meet Christ the King when He comes in glory at the end of the ages. "To Him be glory and power forever and ever. Amen." Happy feast day everyone and have a wonderful Thanksgiving Day!

How do I become Catholic?

We welcome anyone interested in joining the Catholic Church. Each year we conduct two series of classes that lead people through the process of coming into the Catholic Church.

If you have never been baptized or need more instruction in the faith, we offer a series of classes that initially provide you with information to help you determine if this journey is right for you. If you choose to continue, the classes will prepare you for the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist.

A separate series of classes is offered to those who have been previously baptized and have some knowledge of the Catholic faith. This series will help prepare you to enter into full communion with the Church.

Both series of classes are part of the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA). This is not a program, but rather a process by which adults, after hearing the mystery and good news of Jesus Christ proclaimed, seek to enter the way of faith and conversion within the Church as guided by the Holy Spirit who opens their hearts. Every person is different, but all need to take that first step and we hope and pray that you do.

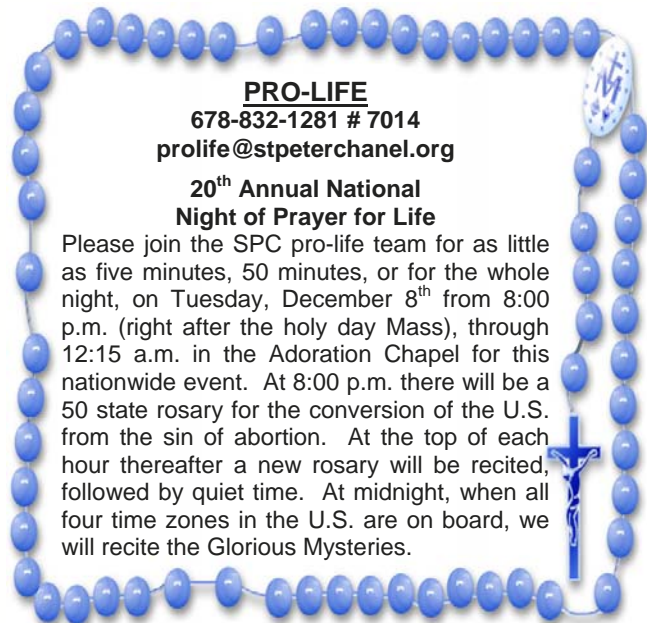
