**Enhance your prayer life this Lenten Season.**

Pray the Liturgy of the Hours. Join a small group every morning following the 6:45 a.m. Mass for Morning Prayer (about 7:15 a.m.) No experience needed. We meet in the main Church by the statue of the Blessed Mother.

**Blessing of the Easter Food on Holy Saturday at 10:00 a.m.**

Bring your basket of food, bread and wine to church and participate in a holy week custom that dates back at least a 1000 years. The blessing of the Easter food is a tradition started in eastern Europe. We are grateful to God for all His gifts of both nature and grace, and, as a token of this gratitude, we have the food of our table sanctified with the hope that spring, the season of the Resurrection, will also be blessed by God's goodness and mercy.



What are some things you can bring? **Eggs**, both decorated and plain are a symbol of new life or rebirth. **Meat**, usually ham or sausage (kielbasa) are indicative of God's favor and generosity. Horseradish, **bitter herbs** signify the bitterness of the suffering of Christ, and salt. **Salt** may also be included because it is necessary to sustain life and a reminder to be the "salt of the earth." **Bread** is always in the basket, both a symbol of communion, the bread of the last supper and the traditional

sweet breads. A **candle** can be included in the basket to represent Christ, the Light of the World. After the blessing, the food is usually set-aside until Easter morning when the head of the house shares the blessed egg, symbol of life, with family and friends. Having exchanged wishes, all continue to enjoy a hearty meal.

**A**sk for His Mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly.

**B**e Merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others.

**C**ompletely trust in Jesus. God wants us to know that the graces of His mercy are dependent upon our trust.
