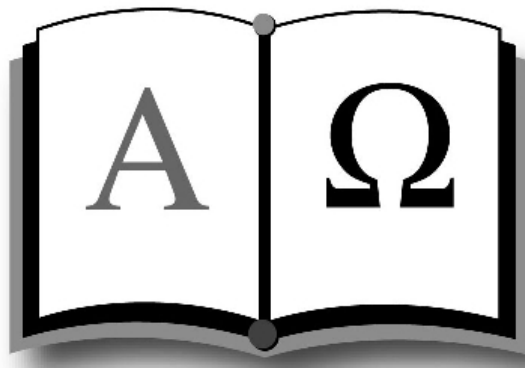

PSR Program Descriptions 2010-2011 Preschool-High School

Abbreviations: SPC- St. Peter Chanel Church Building Classrooms BT- Blessed Trinity HS Classrooms

PRESCHOOL PSR OPTIONS (3-year olds, 4-year olds) (SPC)

- *Catechesis of the Good Shepherd*- Tues.4:30PM, Sun. 8:45AM, Sun 10:30AM,
This session follows a Montessori format in a specially furnished atrium.
- *Sunday Morning PSR Sessions* – Sun 9:00AM and 10:45AM
These sessions follow a traditional small group setting with a focus on Bible Stories and basic Catholic Vocabulary.

ELEMENTARY OPTIONS (Kindergarten-Grade 5)

- *Sunday Morning Sessions*- 9:00-10:15AM or 10:45-Noon, traditional classroom setting with emphasis on Catholic Teachings and active learning. (BT)
- *Wednesday Afternoon Session*- 4:30-5:45PM, traditional classroom setting; emphasis on Catholic Teachings and active learning. (SPC) Family meal and adult sessions are offered in conjunction with Wednesday sessions.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS for Young Children

- *ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR CHILDREN (OCIC) (BT)*
Sunday 9:00 AM Year 1; Sunday 10:30 AM Year 2- Children in grades 3-5 who have not celebrated the sacraments of Baptism or Communion or those who wish to become Catholic explore the teachings and traditions of the church. *This is a two year program.*
- *CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD (CLOW) (SPC)*
Children's Liturgy is a planned program to enrich our children's liturgical experience of God's presence in the ritual proclamation of the Word. CLOW invites children ages 4 ½ years through the 4th grade to worship and pray together at the 9:00 a.m. and 10:45 a.m. Mass most Sundays of the year. *No registration is required for CLOW*, children are dismissed from Mass following the opening prayer.

MIDDLE SCHOOL OPTIONS (Grades 6, 7, and 8)

- *Sunday Morning Sessions*- 9:00-10:15AM or 10:45-Noon, traditional classroom setting with an emphasis on catechesis and active learning. Donuts provided (BT)
- *Sunday Evening Bible Study*- 6:45-8:00 Small group format that includes scripture reading, group discussion and related activities. Pizza is offered from 6:15-6:45(SPC)
- *Wednesday Evening- Bible Study Meets* at 6:30-7:45 PM Small group format that includes scripture reading, group discussion and related activities. (SPC)

SPECIAL PROGRAMS for Middle School

- *Girl's Mentoring*- Open to middle and high school girls, this group meets once each month on a Friday or Saturday evening. Topics vary but typically the event includes mealtime.
- *Middle School Youth Ministry Events offered throughout the year. These events are open to all SPC Middle School Youth and include on site and off site activities. Visit the website for a list of events, activities and permission forms.*
- *ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR YOUTH & TEENS (SPC)*
Sunday – 9:00 AM Year 1; 10:45 Year 2 Youth in middle school and high school who have not celebrated the sacraments of Baptism, or Communion or those who wish to become Catholic. *This is a two year program.* (SPC)

HIGH SCHOOL OPTIONS FOR CONFIRMATION (SPC)

- *Sunday Morning Sessions*- 9:00-10:15AM or 10:45-Noon. Traditional classroom setting with an emphasis on catechesis and active learning, donuts provided.
- *Sunday Evening Sessions*- 6:45 -8:00 PM (Grade 9 & 10) Traditional setting with an emphasis on catechesis and active learning. Participants are encouraged to attend the 5:00PM teen Mass, participate in food and fellowship in McNamee Hall after Mass followed by sessions beginning at 6:45 PM.
- *Wednesday Evening Sessions*– 7:00-8:15PM. Traditional setting with an emphasis on catechesis and community building. .
- **Food and Fellowship*- offered each week that PSR is in session as well as other weeks according to the published schedule. This event is for HIGH SCHOOL Teens only and is held in McNamee Hall following the 5:00 teen Mass. Pizza is offered until 6:45. Sunday night teen sessions begin at 7:00. Those attending sessions at another time and those already confirmed are encouraged to stay for discussion groups or social time.

YOUTH MINISTRY- JUST FOR FUN AND SPIRITUAL GROWTH (SPC)

These options are open to **all teens grades 9-12**. They are designed for teens who want additional opportunities to gather with their parish community.

- *Food and Fellowship* is offered each week that PSR is in attendance as well as other weeks according to the published schedule. This event is for HIGH SCHOOL Teens only and is held in McNamee Hall following the 5:00 teen Mass. Pizza is offered until 6:45. Those attending sessions at another time and those already confirmed are encouraged to stay for discussion groups or social time.
- *Wednesday Evening Mini Courses/Bible Study*– 7:00-8:15 Topics to include life issues, scripture and Catholic Nuggets. This is presented in an adult-education style format.
- *Girl's Mentoring*- Open to middle and high school girls, this group meets once each month on a Friday or Saturday evening. Topics vary but typically the event includes mealtime.

HOME STUDY

- Families may request to home school their children except during sacrament years (Grades 1, 2, 9, & 10).
- All home school families must complete PSR registration, and a Home Study Plan to be submitted to the PSR office and approved by the pastor.
- Once approved, participants must attend a Home School Orientation and complete quarterly reviews to remain in good standing.
- The fee for Home School is the same as regular PSR.

POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

RIGHT TO AMEND

The Pastor and the Director of Religious Education have the right to amend policies and procedures in this handbook. Parents and catechists will be notified in writing if changes are made.

PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES

The primary responsibility for the Religious Education of children belongs to parents. Our efforts to help you achieve that goal require you to stay informed about PSR events, contact us immediately with questions or concerns, and follow the policies outlined in this handbook so that the greater good of the children may be served.

COMMUNICATION

Email-Our preferred method of communications is email so please check your messages regularly. Please let us know if you do not have an email account. Information can also be obtained through our Web page (www.stpeterchanel.org). Email is sent to you as a blind copy to protect the privacy of those in the program. If, however, a broadcast email is sent, please do not use addresses for personal or business purposes. We consider this an invasion of the privacy and an abuse of our system. In accordance with Archdiocesan Policy, we do not release phone numbers or e-mail address lists to a third party.

Handouts and Flyers-Occasionally, we will send home paper handouts. Please do not ask us to send home information from an outside organization or ministry. It is our policy to only send home paperwork that directly concerns the Parish School of Religion.

Bulletin and Web Site-Read the bulletin and website carefully for information on other events that happen in the parish.

ATTENDANCE

Consistent weekly attendance in the PSR program is very important. To credit your child with a full year of religious education, he or she must attend at least 80% of the sessions. When an absence is unavoidable, please request a make-up lesson from your child's catechist and complete it at home. Once the lesson is returned, a makeup will be noted on the attendance record.

CANCELLED CLASSES

In case of inclement weather, especially regarding travel conditions, we will follow advisories from the Georgia State Patrol (404-624-6077).

On any day when questionable weather conditions may affect classes, call 678-277-9423 for a message.

DISCIPLINE

Life as a Christian is a commitment to live by the example of Jesus Christ. This commitment includes student acknowledgement and acceptance of their responsibility for conduct and actions both on church and school property and in the classroom. Normal class discipline problems will be handled by the catechist. If a problem becomes persistent, the student will be referred to the Coordinator. The Coordinator will contact the parent to request a conference. In some situations, a child with a persistent discipline problem may only remain in the class if a parent attends class with the child. If issues remain unresolved, the parents will be provided the resources to home school his/her child. Disciplinary problems include but are not limited to the following: disrespect to a catechist or other student; abusive language; fighting; vandalism; stealing; inappropriate physical contact; leaving the school building or site of the activity.

SPECIAL NEEDS

Children with special needs are welcome to register and participate in any of our offered religious education programs. We ask that parents who have children with chronic illnesses, learning difficulties or physical handicaps, please notify the Religious Education Office. Every attempt will be made to form a plan to meet your child's needs.

PERMISSION SLIPS & HEALTH FORMS

For all events, a permission slip and health form are mandatory. Permission forms are available on our website(www.stpeterchanel.org).

CELL PHONES

Cell phones must be off and out of sight during PSR sessions or events. If a cell phone causes a distraction, a staff member or adult volunteer may take the phone for the duration of the event.

PSR SESSION LOCATIONS (See maps on next page)

Sessions for 3 and 4-year-olds are located in the St. Peter Chanel classrooms. Sunday sessions for age 5 through Age 13 and Adult Education meet in Blessed Trinity High School. Teens meet at St. Peter Chanel. Sunday evening sessions (teens and middle school meet at St. Peter Chanel. All Wednesday sessions meet in St. Peter Chanel Classrooms.

ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE

Catechists and staff are ready to accept children *10 minutes before* their scheduled session. If you arrive earlier, please supervise your child so that we may prepare for the session.

Preschool age children: Parents drop-off and pick-up preschool aged children; at the classroom door.

Elementary/Middle School: Carpool is offered for elementary aged children, however, parents are always welcome to walk their child into the building or pick them up at the classroom door following the session. If you walk your child into the building, **please park in a designated parking spot**. If you normally pick up your child at the classroom but arrive late, you can find him/her in the carpool area with their class. We will not leave unattended children alone in a room.

Older children may pick up younger sibling under the following conditions:

- A note from a parent is on file
- The older child should come to the area of the younger child
- Before leaving, the children must notify the adult supervising
- If we feel your child's safety is compromised, we reserve the right to discontinue sibling pick up.

EARLY DISMISSAL

If your child must leave before the scheduled dismissal time, please go to the Coordinator stationed in the hallway and she will assist you.

- **SIGN THEM OUT:** You may be asked for identification. Please do not be offended; we are trying to provide a safe environment for your child.
- **RECEIVE AN EARLY DISMISSAL PASS:** You will receive an early dismissal pass to give to the catechist. This slip notifies the catechist that you have visited the Religious Education Office and have properly signed out and will take responsibility for the child.

CARPOOL (See Maps on next page)

Drop-off

- Children may be dropped off in the carpool area no more than ten minutes before the scheduled class time.
- Please drop off in the designated area only. This area will be defined with traffic cones and *supervised* by a staff member. In this area, vehicles will be channeled to one lane so that we can safely monitor children entering the building.
- IT IS UNSAFE TO DROP CHILDREN IN OTHER UNSUPERVISED AREAS OF THE PARKING LOT.

Pickup

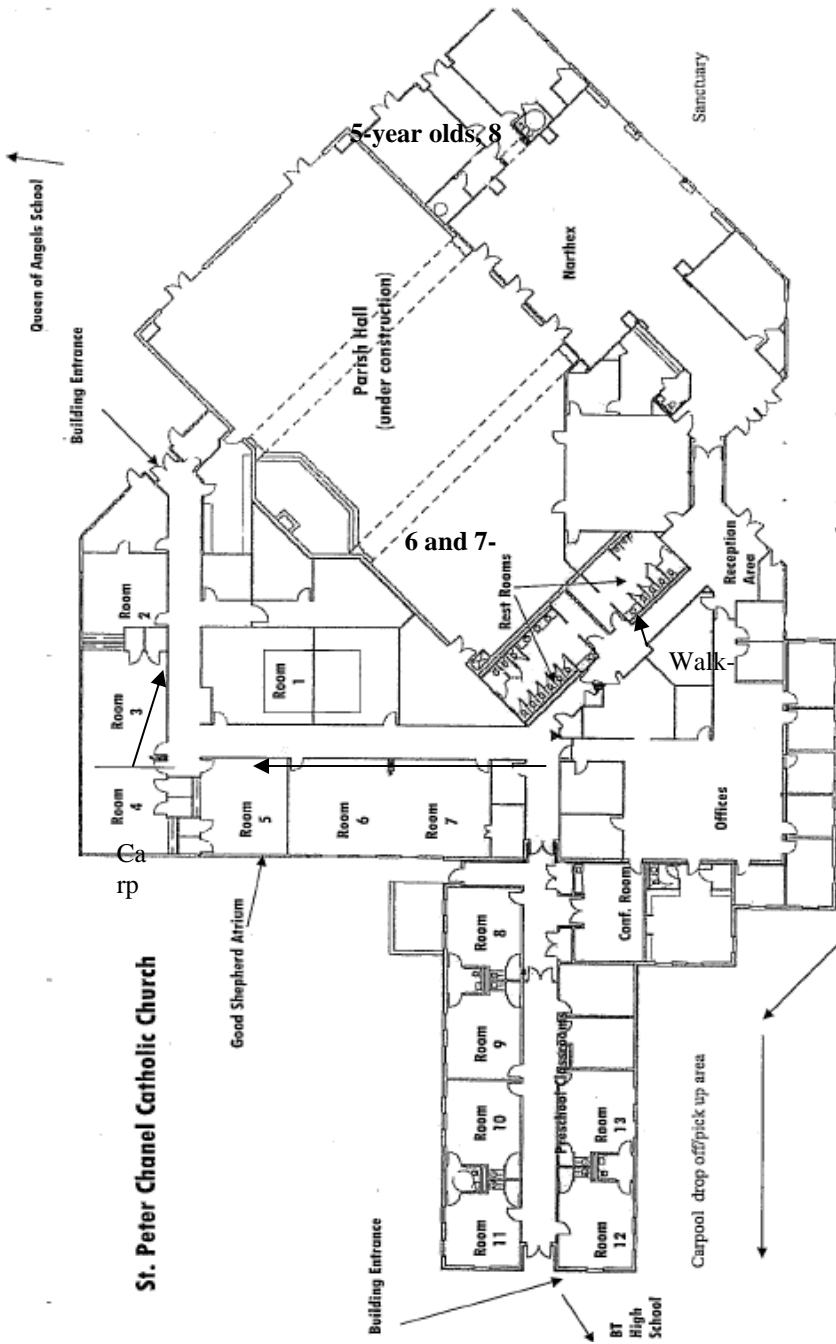
- Catechists are signaled at five minutes before the end of a session. Groups proceed to the carpool area designated for their grade level.
- Enter the carpool area and follow the direction of the staff members moving up as far as traffic permits. If you pass your child's class, we will bring him/her to you. This will help us to load multiple children at once.
- If you normally pick up your child at the classroom but arrive late, you can find him/her in the carpool area with their class. Children may not be left unattended or with only one other adult in a room,

Inclement Weather Carpool

Carpool will take longer on rainy/cold days. Children will wait in the back hall and be called as your car arrives near the door. If you walk in to get your child, please do not enter the double doors used as a carpool exit. Enter the single door (middle school entrance) and come down the hallway. A staff member will call your child. Exit the same door you entered.

CARPOOL CAUTIONS/SAFETY RULES

- Please do not talk on your cell phone during carpool
- Please park only in designated spots
- Drive slowly- children are everywhere
- Use caution when crossing the carpool lane on foot
- Please be patient
- Load only from the passenger side. Cars sometimes pass on the drivers side
- VERY IMPORTANT...If you walk to the sidewalk to receive your child, please CROSS IN THE AREA DESIGNATED BY CONES. Crossing between cars is very dangerous!

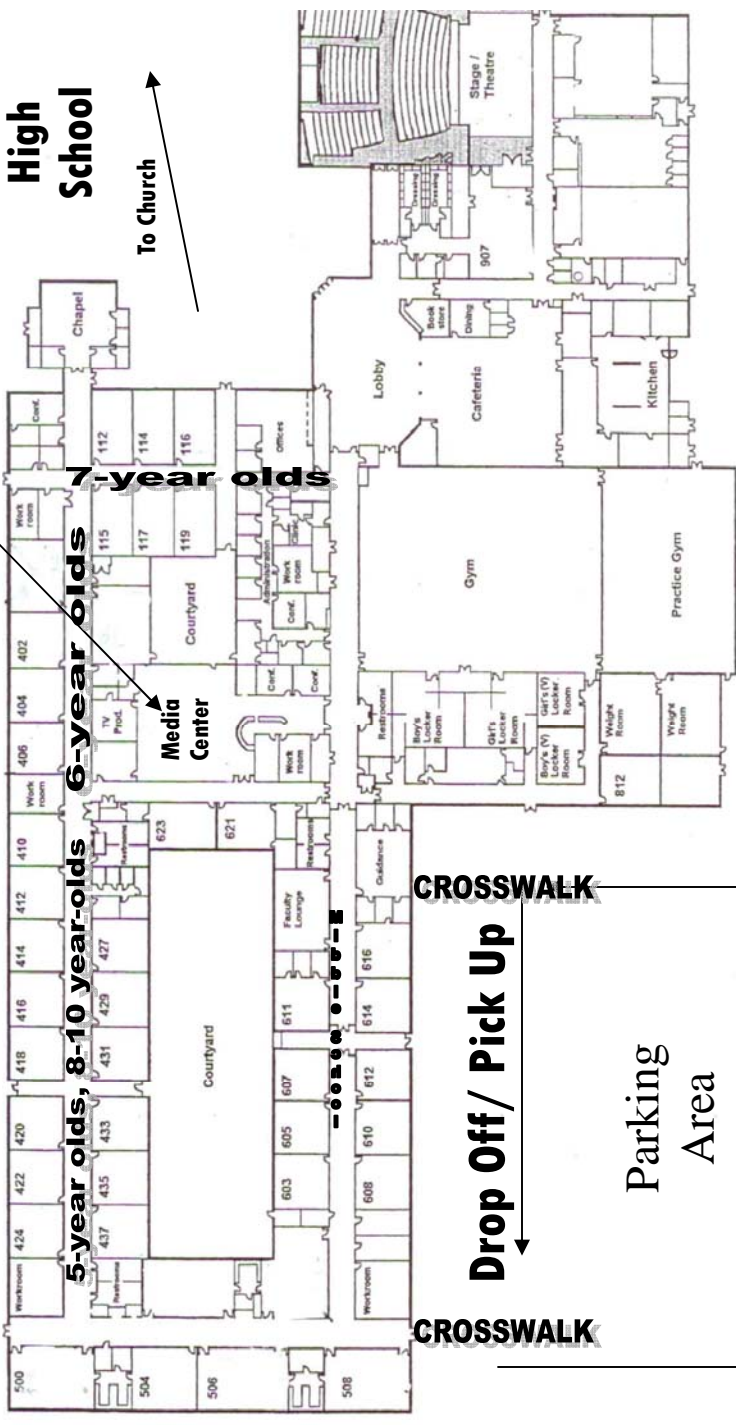

PARKING

Plenty of parking is available at the high school. In order to maintain safety *POLICE WILL TICKET CARS PARKED IN UNDESIGNATED PARKING PLACES.*

FAMILY CUSTODIAL ISSUES

St. Peter Chanel abides by the provisions of the Buckley Amendment with respect to the rights of non-custodial parents. In cases of a divorce decree involving clear custody by one parent, the Director of Religious Education must be informed. A copy of the first page of the decree bearing the case number, the pages referring to custody and the relationship with the school and the final page bearing the judge's signature are to be on file with us. Unless the decree indicates otherwise, all communications are sent to the parent with physical custody. It is the custodial parent's responsibility to inform the Director of Religious Education of any issues relating to release of a child to a non-custodial parent. Non-custodial parents have the right to attend all parent meetings, sacrament celebrations and PSR events unless otherwise indicated by a court order.

PHOTO RELEASES

Photos of PSR activities occasionally appear in published media not limited to local newspapers, *The Georgia Bulletin*, and our parish bulletin. Photo releases are part of our registration form. If you do NOT want your child's photograph to be published, please inform the Director of Religious Education.

SUSPECTED ABUSE

If a child discloses any form of abuse to a catechist or staff member, they immediately report the information to the Director of Religious Education or Pastor. The Director or Pastor will follow all policies outlined by the Archdiocese of Atlanta, Fulton County and the State of Georgia for reporting the abuse. Two reports of significant incidents will be reported to the appropriate authorities.

CURRICULUM

CATECHISTS– Teachers of our PSR classes are referred to as catechists. The word “catechist” has its roots in the very early Church. In the time of St. Augustine, it took on the meaning “to echo.” Catechists are committed to four principles: to proclaim the mysteries of faith, to foster community, to encourage worship and prayer and to motivate service to others.

SUBSTITUTES

As a parent, you may be called to substitute in your child's class. Unless both the teacher and the aide are absent, the parent will serve as the teacher's aide. Parents, other adults, student volunteers and the parish community are essential in helping us provide programs for the children and youth of St. Peter Chanel. We welcome your participation. Please call the Religious Education office to help.

REGISTRATION FEES

PSR registration fees are due with each application; early registration discounts are available before June 15. After that date, the following schedule of fees apply:

One Child \$ 100 **Family Maximum** \$250

This fee helps cover textbook costs, formational activities, sacrament celebrations, training, supplies and special events.

Children who attend Catholic school but will celebrate the sacraments at St. Peter Chanel must also register. This fee of \$50 helps cover formational activities, supplies and resources.

REGISTRATION 10-11

All children of registered parishioners are welcome to participate in Religious Education. Registration for 2010-11 sessions will be held in the spring of 2010. Details concerning registration will be distributed through email to families who have children currently enrolled sessions. Bulletin announcements will also provide registration details.

REFUND POLICY

Refunds are issued as follows:

100% prior to first class. 50% after first class.

No refund after three classes.

A Note Regarding Fees:

We believe no family should be excluded from receiving Catholic religious education because of difficulty in paying fees. Please feel free to contact the Religious Education Office concerning assistance in this area. Confidentiality will be strictly observed.

Attendance at Sunday Mass is an essential part of our Catholic faith. Even our youngest children are encouraged to attend Mass with their family. Although some preschool aged children are unable to sit through Mass, all students in Kindergarten and above should attend Mass weekly.

SACRAMENTS of INITIATION

Formation and celebration of the sacraments involve a commitment of time by participants and their families. Specific requirements for sacramental preparation programs at St. Peter Chanel are:

BAPTISM

For information and/or to schedule a Baptism, please call the Sacrament Assistant (678)832-1214.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION & FIRST RECONCILIATION

According to Archdiocesan guidelines, sacramental preparation consists of foundational preparation and formational preparations specific to the sacraments.

Foundational Preparation is accomplished one of two ways and applies to *both six and seven-year olds (1st and 2nd Grades)*

- Enrollment in the Parish School of Religion class,
- Archdiocesan approved Catholic School attendance.

In both cases, we must have a Sacrament Registration Form and Baptismal Certificate on file for every 7-year old (2nd grader).

Formational Preparation Participation in this phase *applies only to seven year olds**

This component consists of a specific sacrament workshop for both parents and children. It is important that you and your child attend these workshops together. As part of the workshop, the children make special keepsakes for First Holy Communion. Our large numbers make it difficult to duplicate these activities outside the workshop so please make these events a priority by putting other activities aside for the entire event.

**Child's age as of September 1, 2010 determines his or her participation in Formational Preparation..*

OLDER CHILDREN REQUESTING SACRAMENTS

If your child is eight-years old or older and has not celebrated the sacraments of Baptism or First Communion, please contact the Director of Religious Education or the Primary Sacrament Coordinator. A meeting will be arranged to assess your child's needs so that he or she may be placed in an appropriate program.

CONFIRMATION

According to Archdiocesan guidelines, the Sacrament of Confirmation is celebrated in the Candidates' 10th grade year. Two years of sacramental preparation are required and consist of foundational preparation and formational preparation specific to the sacrament.

Foundational Preparation is accomplished by registering for and attending religious education during the 9th and 10th grade years (general age 14 years and 15 years). This can be accomplished by attending a Parish School of Religion class, or Archdiocesan approved Catholic High School. In both cases, participants must attend at least 80% of the sessions.

To be eligible for Confirmation candidates must provide a Sacrament Registration Form, Baptismal Certificate with First Communion notations (or Baptismal plus First Holy Communion certificate). For those not baptized in the Catholic Church, a Profession of Faith document must also be submitted.

A \$50 payment, payable at time of registration, will cover both years of preparation, and all costs associated, with the exception of optional off-site retreats.

Formational Preparation

During *Year One* (9th grade) of preparation each Confirmation Candidate will participate in two service projects*, complete a reflection form for each service project, and complete a Saint Exploration Activity.

Year Two (10th grade) formation preparation includes two service projects*, a completed reflection form for each service project, a Saint Project, a Confirmation Workshop (multiple options), Evening of Reflection, Confirmation Interview, and Confirmation Rehearsal and Review. A Saint Name Form and Sponsor Verification Form must also be completed and submitted.

*Service projects must be completed within the St. Peter Chanel parish community, or be an off-site project affiliated with St. Peter Chanel Catholic Church.
